We need 24 images for our panel and time is running out to submit your images so that they can be considered to represent the club. The work can be of any genre and we are looking for everyone's best photos, new or old. Since this is a new event, there are no restrictions on whether they have been seen previously.

There is a section in PhotoEntry called "MIPP Challenge - CCC Image Selection" to which up to three images can be submitted. The usual criteria, 1400 x 1050 pixels and sRGB colour space, apply. Entries close soon at midnight on 15 July.
